What's Happening and What's New In Nursing?

- **National Certified Nurses Day** is celebrated on **March 19th** each year. It's a day to recognize nurses who have earned and maintain board certification in their specialty. Why March 19? March 19th is the birthday of Margretta "Gretta" Madden Styles, a renowned expert in nurse credentialing. Styles was a leader in the nursing profession, designing the first comprehensive study of nurse credentialing. She was also an advocate for nursing standards and certification.
- **Unvaccinated adult tests positive for measles after dying in New Mexico** By [Sara Kellner](#) Healio March 7, 2025. The news came a little more than 1 week after Texas officials announced that an [unvaccinated child died](#) from measles — the first measles death in the United States in 10 years. Both deaths occurred in a region affected by a measles outbreak that has surpassed 220 cases in New Mexico and Texas. As of March 7, there have been 198 reported cases in western Texas and 30 cases in Lea County. Cases are largely occurring among people who are not vaccinated against measles or whose vaccination status is unknown, according to officials in both states. HHS Secretary **Robert F. Kennedy Jr.** authored a “call to action for all of us to reaffirm our commitment to public health” and said the MMR vaccine is “crucial” to not getting measles. Parents play a pivotal role in safeguarding their children’s health. Vaccines not only protect individual children from measles, but also contribute to community immunity, protecting those who are unable to be vaccinated due to medical reasons.” Kennedy also said the CDC updated its recommendations to support vitamin A treatments for patients with measles. **References:** CDC statement on measles outbreak. <https://www.cdc.gov/media/releases/2025/2025-cdc-statement-on-measles-outbreak.html>. - **FDA approves epinephrine nasal spray for children aged as young as 4 years** Fact checked by [Kristen Dowd](#) [FDA advisory committee votes in support of epinephrine nasal spray for anaphylaxis](#) March 06, 2025 The FDA has approved “neffy” 1 mg epinephrine nasal spray for treating anaphylaxis and other type 1 allergic reactions in children aged 4 years and older, according to a press release from ARS Pharma. The ARS Pharma Patient Assistance Program also will provide neffy 1 mg at no cost to qualified patients. The [neffyinSchools program](#) will provide free neffy 1 mg to eligible schools for stock administration as well.

State

- **Texas Legislature 2025** *The 89th Legislature’s regular session runs from Jan. 14 to June 2, 2025. Republicans control both the Texas House and Senate. We focus on what Texans need to know about the 140-day lawmaking session and how the policies legislators craft could impact people’s lives.*
- **Christi Craddick, Don Huffines announce bids for Texas comptroller after Hegar tapped for A&M chancellor Hegar’s impending departure from the comptroller’s seat creates a rare opening for one of Texas’ coveted statewide offices.** By [Jasper Scherer](#) **March 7, 2025 from the Texas Tribune (excerpts).** *Gov. Greg Abbott will be tasked with appointing a replacement to serve out the remainder of Hegger’s term, which runs through January 2027. The seat is up for reelection in 2026. The comptroller serves as the state’s chief financial officer, accountant, revenue estimator and treasurer. Abbott Huffines, a businessman and GOP donor. If elected, he said, “I will [DOGE](#) Texas by exposing waste, fraud, and abuse in government to increase efficiency and put every penny we save into property tax relief.” Craddick, a Republican, has served on the oil-and-gas-regulating Texas Railroad Commission since 2012. She will not have to give up her seat on the commission to run for comptroller. Craddick, an attorney from Midland. (Texas Tribune)*
- **Winners and losers: Who came out on top — and who didn’t — in the Texas House’s committee assignments.** *There were only so many chair positions to go around, with 30 committees for 88 Republicans, making it inevitable that some would miss out on plum*

appointments. By [James Barragán](#) and [Jasper Scherer](#) Feb. 14, 2025. House Speaker [Dustin Burrows](#) announced his highly anticipated committee appointments. Adding an additional wrinkle this year, a new House rule banned members of the minority party from heading committees, which meant Burrows had to consider how to divide among Republicans while still making sure the Democratic coalition received sub-committees to be satisfied. **(Texas Tribune)**

National

- **AACN Statement on Changes in Federal Policy and Regulations Feb19, 2025** We encourage our community members to seek reliable sources of information about policy and regulatory changes and to avoid amplifying misleading messages. AACN's values and the Code of Ethics for Nurses compel us to fully understand and anticipate the implications of policy on our practice, patients and work environments and to advocate accordingly. - **A bill is reintroduced in Congress to revise provisions in drug-pricing law. Legislation would delay negotiations on small molecule medicines** by Ed Silverman February 25, 2025 Once again, House lawmakers have introduced a bill to alter a key provision of the Inflation Reduction Act in response to arguments that the federal law is discouraging investment in developing so-called small molecule medicines. The [legislation](#), known as the Ensuring Pathways to Innovative Cures Act, would allow Medicare to begin negotiating with pharmaceutical companies over the prices of small molecule medicines 13 years after they reach the market. Currently, negotiations begin after nine years and the legislation — which was re-introduced by Rep. Greg Murphy (R- N.C.) — would shift the timetable so that it is the same as for large molecule medicines, also known as biologics. By making this change, the legislation would remove what the pharmaceutical industry and its investors claim is a disincentive for pursuing small molecule drugs, since these medicines would have less time on the market before Medicare would be able to negotiate set prices.
- **Washington update (February, 2025)**
 - **ENA Launches Registration for Day on the Hill 2025**
Day on the Hill, ENA's premier advocacy event, takes place April 29-30 in the nation's capital. Attendees will learn about ENA's federal legislative priorities and how they can help make the case for change on Capitol Hill. ENA members will also connect with fellow nurses in a supportive and informative environment that culminates with a day of meetings in the House and Senate.  - **ENA Priority Legislation Promptly Reintroduced for 119th Congress**
The Dr. Lorna Breen Health Care Provider Protection Act was recently reintroduced by Sens. Tim Kaine, D-Va., and Todd Young, R-Ind., and Reps. Debbie Dingell, D-Mich., and Jen Kiggans, R-Va. This important bill combats the ongoing problem of mental and emotional fatigue, as well as burnout, associated with providing emergency medical care. The Dr. Lorna Breen Healthcare Provider Protection Act was originally enacted in

2022 during the COVID-19 pandemic to create important programs that provide training, suicide-prevention resources and direct funding to reduce health worker burnout. ENA's recent Action Alert allows you to send [letters of support to your legislators](#).

- **ENA Details Workplace Violence Policy Strategy at Leadership Conference During ENA Leadership Conference 2025**, ENA Director of Government Relations Rob Kramer discussed legislative solutions to the ongoing workplace violence crisis. ENA supports laws in every state to allow local prosecutors to file felony charges against those who assault emergency nurses. Most, if not all, states provide these protections for some other professionals who interact directly with the public, including police officers and firefighters. In addition to imposing stronger criminal penalties, ENA supports state and federal policies to prevent violence and mitigate its impact on emergency nurses through the implementation of workplace violence prevention programs in health care facilities. These plans often require staff training, security measures, worker support and non-retaliation policies. Sixteen states have enacted workplace violence prevention legislation to date.
- **ENA Responds to Recent Public Health Developments** Amid several developments with a potential impact on public health in recent weeks, ENA released a [statement](#) acknowledging several key areas the association continues to monitor. Specifically, ENA mentioned restrictions on the release of information from public health agencies, possible changes to vaccine requirements that protect people from serious disease and illness, and funding cuts for academic institutions that effect research and nursing programs. ENA highlighted these developments, and others, as concerning in the context of access to care for all patients and the ability for emergency nurses to deliver the best possible care to their patients.

Scammers Target Nurses Using Faxed Falsified Documents

Texas Board of Nursing Bulletin January 2025 Volume LVI - No.1

Texas nurses, including advanced practice registered nurses, are being targeted by scammers seeking to extort money making false claims that the Board of Nursing (BON) has suspended the nurse's license(s). The scammers may contact the nurse by phone, make false claims involving controlled substance violations, and require the nurse to send money by wire transfer or other non-recoverable means to temporarily halt disciplinary action against the nurse while the investigation proceeds. Nurses are usually told not to discuss the case with anyone or risk further legal action.

Scammers may ask for a fax number to send fraudulent documents that contain vague allegations, along with other fraudulent documents from agencies such as the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Drug Enforcement Agency, and/or the Department of Justice. The documents sent usually make it appear to be a joint investigation involving both state and federal agencies.

Fraudulent documents sent by scammers may include a graphic such as the BON Banner, a copy of an older BON logo, the nurse's National Provider Identifier (NPI) number, and fake signature(s).

The article stated the Board of Nursing will not:

- * include NPI numbers on correspondence relating to investigations,
- * notify nurses about investigations by Fax.
- * request that nurses send money to pause investigations, or
- * require the nurse to not discuss the investigation with anyone through some type of non-disclosure agreement.

Texas Board of Nursing - Continuing Education

Requirements for RNs

All Texas RNs are reminded to review the Texas Board of Nursing's mandatory continuing education re-licensure requirements located on the website at https://www.bon.texas.gov/education_continuing_education.asp#D

There are several factors which must be kept in mind when reviewing the information on the website:

- Course content must meet the stipulation requirements of the Texas Board of Nursing
- The time frame or licensure cycle for repeating the requirement differs from course to course
- The RN's practice type and/or 'float unit' may determine if a nurse needs to take a course
- Advance Practice RNs (APRN) have additional course requirements than RNs
- Course requirements are not automatically met with certification
- Additional education requirements may be added at any time. These requirements are announced in the Texas Board of Nursing's Bulletin.

Current RN Requirements:

- Forensics Evidence Collection
- Older Adult and Geriatric Care
- Nursing Jurisprudence and Ethics
- *Human Trafficking Prevention

****Must be an approved Texas HHS course.***

Current APRN Requirements:

- Pharmacotherapeutics
- Tick-Borne Diseases
- *Pain management and prescription of opioids
- *Prescription of opioids
- Authorization to receive information from the Texas Prescription Monitoring Program

**** All APRNs with prescriptive authority authorized to prescribe opioids***

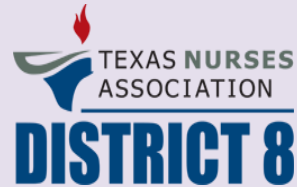
